## 1. Introduction

NY Highways must ensure all depots are a safe environment to work in. This procedure details what is expected of visitors entering NY Highways depots.

## 2. Scope

This procedure covers visitors entering, working within and exiting NY Highways depots. This procedure does not include deliveries, driver deliveries or fuelling up.

## 3. Responsibilities

### 3.1 Supervisors / Depot Supervisor

- Make sure visitors have the appropriate induction.
- Ensure all visitors entering the yard are wearing the correct PPE to meet NY Highways standards.
- Must safeguard their own safety as well as that of NY Highways employees and the public.
- Must ensure visitors have the correct experience, required certification and training to undertake their task within NY Highways depots. No visitors, delivery driver or mates delivering to a NY Highways Depot are to undertake any task for which they are not trained nor have the necessary experience to make them competent.
- **Must** report all “Near Misses” and “Incidents” onto CSN incidents app.

### 3.2 Visitors

- Visitors **Must** sign in on the “visitors sign in” sheet.
- Visitors will be inducted by a NY Highways supervisor.
- Are responsible for their own safety.
- Supply and use their own PPE.
- Report **All** incidents and near misses to a NY Highways supervisor.
- Follow instructions given by NY Highways employees while within any NY Highways depot.

### 3.3 Employees

- Report any visitors seen failing to abide by the “Depot Visitor Procedure” to a supervisor.

## 4. Procedure

### 4.1 Before entering NY Highways depots

- Visitors, entering NY Highways Depots must report to NY Highways reception or NY Highways employee.
- No visitor must enter a Depot without authorisation.
- Visitors must sign in using the “Visitor Sign-in Sheet”.
- Visitors should have a depot induction.

### 4.2 Working within NY Highways depots

- Visitors to the yard must wear full PPE in line with “NY Highways PPE Standard”.
- NY Highways operate a reverse parking policy. Banksman must be used to assist vehicle movements in Depots where more than the driver is on site.
- Visitors parking in the designated car parks must reverse, however there is no requirement for a banksman.
- Vehicles and contents are left at driver’s risk.
- Alcohol and drugs are strictly forbidden, anyone found under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be removed from the Depot.
- Smoking and vaping, within the depot premises, is prohibited. Smoking and vaping are only allowed in designated areas outside of the depot ground.
- Mobile phones and other digital devices are not to be used when driving/operating plant and machinery. When using such devices the operator should find a safe place and remain there during the activity.
- Vehicles in NY Highways Depots must be fitted with beacons of a ‘twin’ design (illuminated by two separate lamps) must be used at all times when the vehicle is travelling in a depot,

and where required when stationary. These can be of any configuration i.e., strobe, rotator, LED, or a combination of, and must be visible through 360 degrees.

#### 4.3 Exiting NY Highways depots

- Visitors must remember to sign out when leaving the depot.
- Visitors must hand back any temporary passes when leaving the depot.
